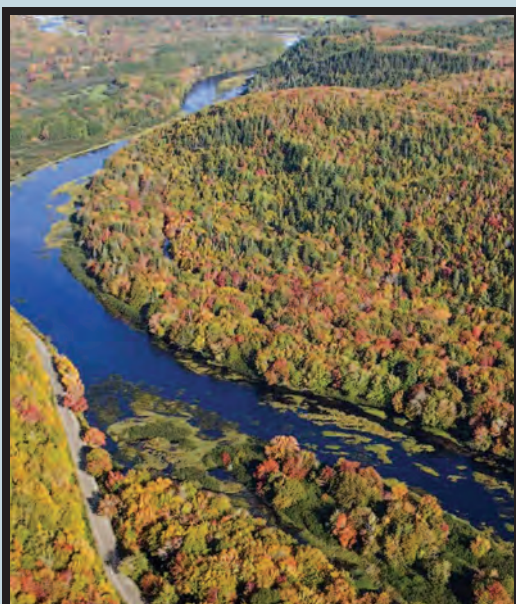


Canada's spectacular landscapes, extensive natural resources, famous recreation, fascinating history and culture, and friendly people draw visitors from all over the world.

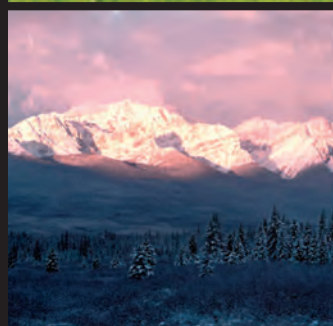
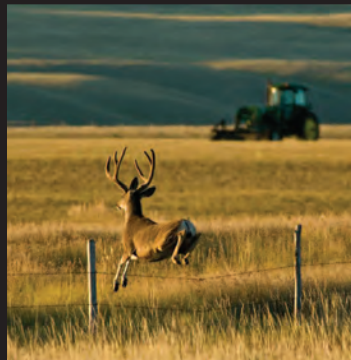
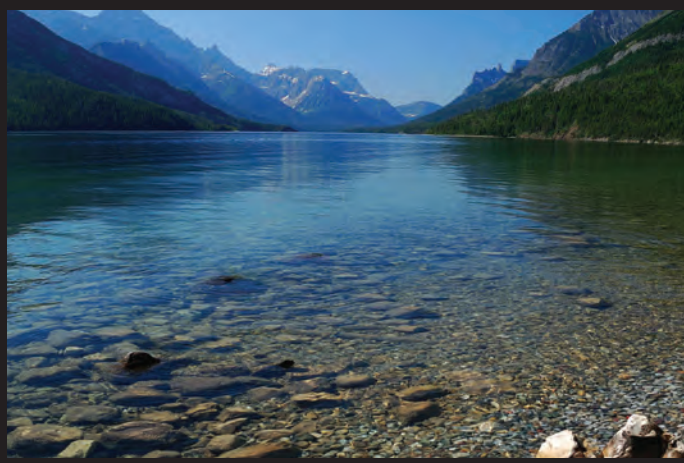




American Friends of Canadian Land Trusts (AF) is an innovative non-profit created by leading conservation professionals from both countries to secure the future of signature Canadian landscapes by removing tax-related obstacles.

Working with AF, U.S. taxpayers can finally afford to achieve their protection goals for Canadian properties that are conservation priorities.

Americans can donate their Canadian land (or a conservation easement over that land) to AF or support Canadian conservation organizations by contributing cash or securities to AF. All donations are eligible for U.S. income tax deductions. Gifts of land or easements are also exempt from Canadian capital gains taxes.



By increasing the financial feasibility of these gifts, AF is increasing the pace, scope and sustainability of land protection in Canada and bringing essential funding to Canadian land trusts.

All of AF's projects involve qualified Canadian conservation entities, including government agencies. AF invites potential partners to become part of this unique cross border collaboration. Americans are encouraged to support AF's efforts to protect Canada's rich heritage and diverse communities, its partnerships with land trusts and landowners and our shared goal of building an ever-stronger Canadian conservation movement.
